


Figure 1: Grade Chart

Gender Chart




Figure 2: Gender Chart

Age Chart




Figure 3: Age Chart

2 PERCENTAGE TABLES

The following tables contain frequency distribution detailing how your students responded to each question on the survey. The tables appear in the same order as the questions on the survey. 












